HIP ARTHROSCOPY POST-OPERATIVE DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS

General:

- Dressings left on for 48 hours after surgery
- 48 hours after surgery you may:
 - remove dressings and place clean DRY band-aids over incisions
 - if the incisions are still draining, place a waterproof dressing (such as an op-site) over the incision site until it is dry
 - if there is no drainage from the incisions, you may shower...do not scrub over incisions or place any ointments on it, pat dry and place new band-aids over incisions
- Hip brace at all times (including sleep)
 - Can remove brace for showering
- CPM (continuous passive motion)
 - You may need to place a rolled-up towel on the lateral side of your knee while in the machine
 - This will prevent your hip from turning out into external rotation
 - You will need assistance to get into the CPM for the first couple of days after surgery.
 - You may also place a rolled towel behind your lower back to prevent low back pain.
 - Place the CPM in the middle of the bed, rather than a narrow area like a couch, to prevent it and your leg from falling off the bed.
- Weight-bearing status
 - Foot Flat Weight Bearing (20lbs) with crutches
 - You can check the amount of weight using a bathroom scale

Physical Therapy:

- Please see physical therapy packet
- It will help to take your pain medication 30 minutes before therapy

Please make sure your post-op appointment is made for $\underline{6-10}$ days after your surgery!!

Your hip may be painful after surgery. In order to control this pain, see below for medicine that you may take.

Prescription (given day of surgery):

Oxy IR (or Vicodin for those with Oxy IR allergy)

→ 1-2 pills every 4-6 hours as needed for pain

Zofran 8 mg - to begin the day after surgery

→ 1 pill every 12 hours as needed for nausea/vomiting

Over-the- counter:

Tylenol Extra Strength (500 mg)

- → 2 pills every 8 hours as needed for pain
- → DO NOT use if you are taking Vicodin (Vicodin has Tylenol in it)

Motrin 200 mg (or Ibuprofen)

→ 2-3 pills every 8 hours as needed for pain

Colace 100 mg

→ 1 pill every 12 hours as needed for constipation

ightharpoonup fever greater than 101.5 degrees F

 \Rightarrow excessive redness or swelling of incisions

⇒ yellow (pus) drainage at incision sites

Anesthesia:

- Some anesthesia drugs you may have received can take up to 24 hours to leave your system completely.
- For this reason, you should not ingest any alcoholic beverages, drive a car, operate machinery, or make any important decisions for 24 hours after your surgery or while taking pain medication.
